

## The Cottage Coaster

### Crochet Pattern

\*Original pattern designed and written by Karen Moniz of Crochet Crafty © 2019. Enjoy!



| Materials   | Stitch Legend       |
|---|---------------------|
| - Hook - 4.5 mm   | Rnd – round         |
| - Yarn – medium weight 4<br>(Bernat Handycrafter Cotton Yarn was used in this photo)  | st(s) – stitch(es)  |
| * 20-30 grams approx for each coaster (2 or 3 different colours would be recommended) | ch(s) – chains(s)   |
| This design will give you a diameter of 5 inches across or 12.75 cm                   | sl st – slip stitch |
| - Scissors  | DC – double crochet |
| - Yarn needle   | * - repeat          |

### Pattern

Begin with a cinch circle (also known as a magic ring) and ch 3 to begin

#### Rnd – 1

- Place 2 DC into the circle and then ch 2 (this will form your first side and corner of your pentagon shape)
- Then place 3 DC and ch 2 into the circle\*
- \* repeat the above three more times until you create a total of 5 sides and 5 corners
- After you ch 2 for the last time, sl st to the top of your first ch 3 to join your round
- Snip your yarn and fasten off

(Round 1 is complete)  
You can take this time to pull on your cinch tail to close in your centre.



## Round – 2

- Place a slip knot on your hook with the next colour yarn
- sl st to join in any corner
- ch 3, then insert 1 DC, ch 2, 2 DC into the corner space



- next, place 1 DC into each of the next 3 st(s) until you reach the next corner space (you should have a total of 5 stitches across)



- then place 2 DC, ch 2, 2 DC into the next corner space and again place 1 DC into each of the next 3 stitches until you reach the next corner \*

\* repeat this 3 more times until you reach your first ch 3 from the beginning of round 2

- sl st to join at the top of the ch 3 and round 2 is complete.

You should have a total of 35 stitches at the end of this round. (We are not counting the ch 2 spaces.) If you are changing colours, you would snip off your yarn and fasten off here.



### Round – 3

- place a slip knot on your hook with the next colour and sl st to join in any corner (in the video tutorial I don't always attach in the corner but I find it's the easiest place for newer crocheters to attach a new yarn)
- ch 4 and then place 1 DC into the same corner space (our corners will now only have 1 DC-ch1-1DC in them)
- now place 1 DC into each of the next 7 stitches across to the next corner (your side will now have 8 st(s) by the time you get to the next corner)
- then place 1 DC, ch1, 1DC into the corner space and continue placing 1DC into each st until you reach the next corner \*
- \* repeat this 3 more times until you get back to your original ch 3 at the beginning of this round
- sl st into the top of the ch 3 you began the round with to complete this round then snip your yarn and fasten off.

You will now have 45 stitches in total at the end of round 3. (We are not counting the ch1 corners.)



## Round – 4

- place a slip knot on your hook with the next colour and sl st to join in any corner
- ch 4 and place 1 DC back into that corner space
- insert 1 DC into each of the next 9 st(s) across to the next corner
- then place 1 DC, ch1, 1DC into the corner space and continue placing 1DC into each st until you reach the next corner \*
- \* repeat this 3 more times until you get back to your original ch 3 at the beginning of this round
- sl st into the top of the ch 3 you began the round with to complete this round then snip your yarn and fasten off.

You will now have 55 stitches in total at the end of round 4. Repeat Rnds 1-4 to create as many coasters as you wish.

**And your Cottage coaster is complete!**
